**ORDER NO. 1
CASE SCHEDULE AND PROCEDURES**

I. JURISDICTION AND NOTICE

On October 28, 2010, the administrative law judge (ALJ) convened a preliminary hearing at the Hays County Courthouse, 3rd Floor Courtroom, 111 East San Antonio Street, San Marcos, Texas. The Executive Director (ED) of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (Commission) offered in evidence ED Exhibits A through D for the purpose of establishing jurisdiction. The Commission and the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) have jurisdiction to consider this matter.

Some of the persons present challenged notice because they not receive written notice of the preliminary hearing or because they knew of others who did not receive written notice of the hearing. The ED agreed to re-examine the list of persons and entities to whom ED sent notice. By November 30, 2010, the ED will file a status report with the ALJ about its compliance with the notice provisions.

In addition, some persons objected to the sufficiency of the notice as published or mailed. The objections were that the ED was required to include a map of the service area and a mailing list of the persons potentially affected by the proposal made by the ED. The ALJ overruled the objections on the grounds that : (1) the map was included by reference in the ED's report, a copy which is available on the Commission's website and in many public libraries and buildings, and (2) the mailing list was provided by the ED to the Commission's chief clerk, as required by law.

II. PARTY STATUS

IV. PROCEDURAL RULES

The proceedings in this case will be conducted in accordance with the procedural rules of the Commission and SOAH. 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE (TAC) ch.80 and 1 TAC ch. 155. In the event of a conflict, the Commission's rules apply. SOAH Rule 155.1(d).

Before Monday, November 8, 2010, all fax filings to SOAH shall be sent to (512) 475-4994. Beginning Monday, November 8, 2010, all fax filings to SOAH shall be sent to (512) 322-2061.

Documents to be filed at SOAH must be received by 3:00 p.m. on the date the filing is due. The deadline for serving other parties is 4:00 p.m. on the date the filing is due.

V. DISCOVERY

A person who has been admitted as a party is subject to discovery. Discovery will be conducted according to the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure (TRCP), as supplemented by SOAH's discovery rules. SOAH Rule 155.251. Two rounds of discovery will be permitted. Discovery responses will be due 30 days from the date of receipt of written discovery request. Discovery documents shall be served on the other parties, but shall not be filed with the ALJ.

A party may file a motion to compel responses to discovery only after conferring with the non-responsive party to resolve the disputes. A motion to compel should include a copy of the discovery correspondence that is necessary for the ALJ to make an informed ruling.

The total time for the ED, other parties, and groups of aligned parties, to each take oral depositions may not exceed 15 hours unless otherwise agreed, or for good cause shown. Each party, or group of aligned parties may divide its total time among the witnesses as it sees fit. The total number of written interrogatories and requests for admissions that any party may serve on any other party may not exceed 25. 30 TAC § 80.152(c).

VI. SERVICE OF PLEADINGS

Until the final mailing list is established by the ALJ on or after December 15, 2010, the parties shall use the service list attached to this order and attach a copy of that list to each filing.

VII. PREFILED EVIDENCE

All parties and groups of aligned parties shall prefile their direct-case evidence in writing by the date shown in the procedural schedule. One copy shall be served on the representative of each party, and one copy shall be filed with the ALJ. Rebuttal evidence and documents used for impeachment or rebuttal purposes need not be prefiled. The prefiled evidence should include all testimony and other evidence necessary to support a party's direct case.

Good cause must be shown if a party wishes to offer evidence at the hearing if the evidence has not been prefiled and is not being used for cross-examination. Good cause will be determined on the offering party's showing a need for the additional evidence, that need could not have been reasonably anticipated, the evidence was inadvertently not prefiled due to an error, and the other parties will not be unduly prejudiced by the late offering of the evidence. The party with the burden of proof is cautioned not to attempt to gain a strategic advantage by saving evidence for rebuttal that is more properly part of its direct case, since that might lead to a motion for summary disposition.

At the hearing on the merits, a party may opt to conduct a summary direct of its expert witnesses, not to exceed 10 minutes per witness. The summary direct may be by witness narrative or by question and answer. Repetitive testimony will not be allowed.

Prefiled testimony shall be written as if the questions were asked by the party's lawyer and answered by the witness. Each witness must be called to testify and adopt the prefiled testimony under oath. The testimony should then be offered as an exhibit. Each party will have an opportunity to cross-examine the witness unless that opportunity has been waived.

Every line on each page of prefiled testimony shall be numbered and every page of every prefiled document shall be appropriately numbered, preferably in the lower right corner, to allow easy identification and reference.

Each party that presents evidence will provide a Record Set, an Appeal Set, a copy for the witness stand, and a copy for each party. Every exhibit will be premarked with the name and the number of the exhibit. The offering party will provide the "Record Set" and the "Appeal Set" to the court reporter before the hearing starts.

VIII. DOCUMENTS UNDER SEAL

The ALJ intends to strictly limit admission of evidence under seal and closing of the hearing on the merits to the public. The parties shall negotiate prior to the hearing to agree on redacted versions of any confidential documents that can be admitted or to stipulate to facts to which they pertain. If the parties are legitimately unable to reach an agreement, the ALJ will resolve the dispute at the hearing in a session closed to the public.

IX. TRANSCRIPT

The ED shall arrange for and pay a court reporter to record and transcribe the hearing on the merits and deliver the original transcript to the ALJ and two copies to the Commission's Chief Clerk after the end of the hearing. SOAH Rule 155.43(b) and 30 TAC § 80.23 (b)(4). The delivered transcript shall also include electronic copies thereof on disc in text format. When the Commission makes a final decision in this case, the costs of the recording and transcription shall be allocated among the parties in accordance with 30 TAC § 80.23.
